

**ADDENDUM A
TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN
NATIONAL DONG HWA UNIVERSITY (NDHU)
AND THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO, A BODY CORPORATE
FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS AND SCIENCES (CLAS)
DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS
UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO DENVER (CU DENVER)**

PURPOSE

This ADDENDUM to the Memorandum of Understanding between NDHU and CU Denver, pertains specifically to the Articulation Agreement with the Department of Economics, located within CLAS, at CU Denver; and outlines the procedures, criteria and timelines for NDHU undergraduate students to start Graduate Economics program at CU Denver in their senior (fourth) year. Unless stated otherwise, this agreement incorporates the terms and conditions of the antecedent MOU between NDHU and CU Denver.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The program will allow NDHU fourth-year undergraduate students who meet the following criteria to be provisionally admitted to CU Denver's MA in Economics, or MS in Health Economics program, and start the Master program at CU Denver in their fourth year.

1. Meet all general graduate admission requirements.
2. Provide proof of English language proficiency (ELP) if they meet ANY of the options listed below

3. Be a current Economics major at National Dong Hwa University with a GPA of 3.0 or better.
4. Have completed a minimum of 15 credit hours (5 courses) in undergraduate economics.
5. The following courses must have been completed at National Dong Hwa University or at CU Denver with a grade of B or better: Calculus (II), Microeconomics (II), and Econometrics (I).
6. Students who do not meet the 3.0 GPA requirement or any part of Requirement 5 may apply but may be required to submit GRE scores and/or two letters of recommendation; otherwise, both are waived.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

CU DENVER

1. To honor the partnership, CU Denver will waive the following materials which are required for international applicants:
 - Application fees of \$75 for each NDHU Fourth-Year students applying to this program.
 - Personal Statement / Answers to Essay Questions
 - GRE Test and Letters of Recommendations as outlined above
2. Tuition and Fees:
 - NDHU students will pay standard international student tuition and fees that are published at the Bursar's Office website. Scholarships, Teaching Assistantships, or Research Assistantships are not guaranteed, but students can apply when funds are available.
3. Students will not be awarded the master's degree until they officially graduate from NDHU with the diploma/graduation certificate.

NDHU

1. NDHU will help to promote this program among the ECON students
2. NDHU will designate a point-of-contact person to communicate with CU Denver for admissions and transcript related questions if there is any

DURATION

This Addendum will be valid from the date of signature of the last Party to sign it. It will remain valid until the expiration date of the MOU signed by both parties. It shall be subject to modifications by mutual accord or termination at any time by either institution upon receipt of three months' written notice. Termination of the Addendum shall not affect activities already in progress as of the date of notification.
